FRCC receives \$150K scholarship bequest

Front Range Community College Foundation recently received the largest scholarship bequest in its 15-year history. The \$150,000 bequest came from the estates of Kenneth and Dorothy Beil of Fort Collins. The bequest will endow the Kenneth and Dorothy Beil Scholarship. Proceeds from the endowment should fund at least two \$3,000 scholarships a year for students who attend any FRCC campus and who demonstrate financial need, Celeste Sikora, FRCC Foundation director, stated in a news release. At FRCC's resident tuition and fee rate, \$3,000 is a full scholarship, according to the release. The first scholarships will be awarded for the fall semester.
